MIDTOWN ATLANTA

1	Accenture Innovation Hub	As one of ten Accenture Innovation Hubs in the U.S., the Atlanta hub is a destination where clients can co-innovate with Accenture teams to ideate, rapidly prototype and scale innovative products and services for the digital economy. Accenture's 30,000-square-foot innovation hub opened at the Centergy building in Midtown's Tech Square in 2018.
2	Anthem Innovation Studio	As Anthem's national digital hub, the Atlanta innovation studio is focused on enhancing the consumer health care experience, improving quality of care and lowering health care costs. Anthem's 6,500-square-foot innovation studio opened at the Centergy building in Midtown's Tech Square in 2016.
3	AT&T Drive Studio	AT&T's Atlanta Drive Studio is the first connected car innovation center in the U.S. to be opened by a wireless carrier. It is a working lab for testing and developing technologies to enhance driving experience by improving safety, convenience and entertainment. AT&T's 5,000-square-foot drive studio opened on West Peachtree Street in Midtown in 2014.
4	AT&T Foundry	As one of six AT&T foundries in the world, AT&T's Atlanta Foundry is focused on taking ideas to market as quickly as possible. The team works on advanced internet access solutions, software-defined networking, Smart Cities, and emerging video and entertainment applications. AT&T's 8,000-square-foot foundry opened at the Centergy building in Midtown's Tech Square in 2013.
5	BlackRock iHub	BlackRock selected Atlanta in 2018 to establish its first innovation hub in North America. The asset management and technology solutions provider has two other iHubs in India and Budapest. The Atlanta iHub will grow to 1,000 employees. BlackRock employees were initially located in WeWork's location in Midtown's CODA building. In 2020, BlackRock moved into its permanent space in Midtown's 725 Ponce building.
6	Boeing Manufacturing Development Center	Located in Midtown on Georgia Tech's campus in the Delta Advanced Manufacturing Pilot Facility, Boeing opened an advanced research center in 2017. The team of Boeing engineers and Georgia Tech students focus on innovative factory automation solutions in aerospace.
7	Chick-fil-A Technology Innovation Center	At Chick-fil-A's newest innovation center, Chick-fil-A works with faculty and students from surrounding colleges on digital technology including data analytics, machine learning, AR and IoT. Chick-fil-A's 6,000-square-foot innovation center opened at The Biltmore building in Midtown's Tech Square in 2018.
8	Daimler AG (Mercedes-Benz) Lab 1886 USA	Daimler's Lab 1886 USA is one of Daimler's four corporate incubators in the world and the first in the U.S. Daimler is focused on commercializing technologies and developing mobile applications and processes for connectivity, sharing, autonomous and electric driving. In 2018, Lab 1886 USA opened in Buckhead within the WeWork coworking space at Terminus. In 2019, Lab 1886 USA moved from Buckhead to Spring Street in Midtown.
9	Delta Air Lines "The Hangar" Innovation Center	A team of 25 at Delta's global innovation center – "The Hangar" – harness research, design and technology to explore ideas that enable effortless travel. Delta opened the 6,500-square-foot space at the Centergy building in Midtown's Tech Square in 2016.
10	Elavon "The Greenhouse" Innovation Lab	At "The Greenhouse," payment processor Elavon is focused on solving FinTech problems and developing solutions for clients and internal processes. Elavon opened "The Greenhouse" as an idea incubator and accelerator on Means Street in Midtown in 2018.
11	Emerson "The Helix" Innovation Center	Emerson is focused on development and collaboration on big data and IoT concepts for markets including supermarket refrigeration, food service operations, residential connected homes, data center cooling, industrial refrigeration and light commercial buildings. The 1,600-square-foot space known as "The Helix" opened at the Centergy building in Midtown's Tech Square in 2016.
12	Georgia-Pacific Point A Center for Supply Chain Innovation	Georgia-Pacific's Point A Center for Supply Chain Innovation is a member-driven, cooperative hub bringing together experts from around the world to develop solutions for building the world's most efficient supply chain by exploring robotics, AI, blockchain, machine learning and autonomous vehicles. Point A opened in 2018 within Midtown's TechSquare Labs, then moved to Midtown's CODA building in 2019. Point A will move into its permanent space of 23,000 square feet at Georgia-Pacific's corporate headquarters in Downtown in 2020. Point A's more than 30 member companies have access to innovation workshops and sprints following a five-step innovation process.

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13	Honeywell Connected Enterprise	Honeywell, a Fortune 100 software-industrial company, opened its Midtown operation on Peachtree Street in 2018 with approximately 62,000 square feet. In 2020, Honeywell will double the space for a total of 124,000 square feet. The company's software innovation division - Honeywell Connected Enterprise – is focused on connected technologies for buildings, industrial plants, workers, automobiles and aircraft. Honeywell's software engineers develop software products in the areas of IoT, mobile, cloud computing and data analytics, as well as marketing and user experience.
14	Invesco Labs	Invesco, a global investment management firm based in Atlanta, opened Invesco Labs in Midtown's CODA building in 2020. In this new space, Invesco's goal is to grow the Strategy Innovation and Planning (SIP) team which focuses on AI, emerging technology, and Intentional Innovation efforts across Invesco. Initial team members include full stack developers responsible for exploring solutions in AI, machine learning, blockchain, NLP, and virtual assistants. The Invesco Labs network includes existing spaces in New York, Houston and India.
15	Keysight Technologies Software Design Center	Keysight, the world's leading electronic measurement company, is focused on developing next-generation software for use in the design and test of electronic products being created by Keysight's customers around the world. In 2016, Keysight opened the center at the Centergy building in Midtown's Tech Square. In 2019, Keysight moved into 50,000 square feet at Midtown's CODA building.
16	KPMG Ignition Center	At KPMG's Atlanta innovation hub, developers, data scientists and information architects develop software and services related to data and analytics, mobile, taxes, human resources and cloud computing. The 22,000-square-foot KPMG Ignition Center opened on West Peachtree Street in Midtown in 2017.
17	NCR Innovation Lab	The NCR Innovation Lab keeps NCR at the forefront of new technologies and innovations including in the areas of artificial intelligence, mobile, big-data, cloud, machine learning and predictive analytics. The lab opened in 2018 within NCR's corporate headquarters on Spring Street in Midtown.
18	Siemens Data Analytics and Applications Center	Siemens is focused on digital services and data analytics to improve operations and safety for rail transportation providers. Siemens Data Analytics and Applications Center opened at the Centergy building in Midtown's Tech Square in 2017.
19	Southern Company Energy Innovation Center	Southern Company focuses on testing and commercializing next-generation products and services in electric transportation, home automation, energy efficiency, renewables, indoor agriculture and biopharma. The 6,000-square-foot Southern Company Energy Innovation Center opened at the Centergy building in Midtown's Tech Square in 2015.
20	Stanley Black & Decker Digital Accelerator	Stanley Black & Decker is focused on advancing digital excellence, including mobile apps and digital marketing, across the enterprise. The 5,000-square-foot Stanley Black & Decker Digital Accelerator opened on 10 th Street in Midtown in 2015.
21	The Home Depot Innovation Center	At The Home Depot Innovation Center, The Home Depot associates, and Georgia Tech students test and develop new technologies to advance retail, supply chain and more. The 6,500-square-foot innovation center opened at the Centergy building in Midtown's Tech Square in 2015.
22	thyssenkrupp Elevator Americas Research Innovation Center	thyssenkrupp Elevator, one of the world's leading elevator companies, conducts groundbreaking research and creates new products and solutions with Georgia Tech interns. thyssenkrupp Elevator's Research Innovation Center opened at the Centergy building in Midtown's Tech Square in 2013 then moved to Midtown's CODA building in 2019.
23	UCB Solution Accelerator	Pharmaceutical company UCB is focused on improving patient care and patient experience using machine learning and advanced analytics resources. The 2,500-square-foot UCB Solution Accelerator opened at the Centergy building in Midtown's Tech Square in 2016.

24	Deloitte iLab	The iLab is Deloitte Consulting's product development center for the Products & Solutions practice that houses prototyping, development and maintenance capabilities for multiple software technologies including wearables, machine learning, advanced analytics and social/mobile. Deloitte opened the 26,000-square-foot iLab in Downtown in 2014.
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25	EY wavespace	EY opened its wavespace center in Atlanta in 2019 to help companies drive digital business transformation through an immersive experience. In wavespace, EY curates talent and technology, bringing them together in a collaboration proven to energize and align teams so they can solve problems and create outcomes that matter. The 3,598-square-foot Atlanta wavespace, located within the EY offices at 55 Allen Plaza, is part of EY's network of 20 wavespace centers around the world.
26	InComm Go Studio	Payments technology company InComm's Go Studio is an innovation hub dedicated to developing emerging technologies for customer-centric products and solutions, utilizing blockchain, artificial intelligence, voice assistants and more. The Go Studio opened in 2020 within the company's Downtown headquarters on Williams Street.

27	Chick-fil-A "Hatch" Innovation Center	Hatch, Chick-fil-A's 32,000-square-foot Innovation Center, opened in 2012 and is the company's immersive space designed to make innovation education and application opportunities available to everyone in the organization, and to help move projects through the innovation process as fast and efficiently as possible.

28	Emory Healthcare Innovation Hub powered by Sharecare	The Emory Healthcare Innovation Hub powered by Sharecare is a premier health care advancement and commercialization program that connects all the pieces of the health care continuum to validate, accelerate and realize ideas. Emory Healthcare and Sharecare launched the 10,000-square-foot innovation hub focused on patient care solutions in Emory's Executive Park location in 2018.

29	Elavon "The Grove" Mobile Innovation Center	At "The Grove," payment processor Elavon is focused on creating new technologies for mobile payments and security solutions and expanding existing mobile solutions. The 10,000-square-foot global innovation center opened within Elavon's corporate headquarters in Sandy Springs in 2013.
30	Emory Healthcare/Verizon 5G Lab	In 2020, Verizon and Emory Healthcare partnered to open the nation's first 5G healthcare innovation hub in Sandy Springs. Verizon's 5G Ultra Wideband will allow researchers the ability to explore solutions such as connected ambulances, remote physical therapy and next-generation medical imaging. Verizon will collaborate with Emory Healthcare and its nine innovation hub partners, including founding partner Sharecare.
31	First Data Learning & Innovation Center	The First Data Learning & Innovation Center supports the company's ongoing commitment to learning and innovation in payment technologies and services solutions. The 10,000-square-foot space opened within First Data's corporate headquarters in Sandy Springs in 2012.
32	General Motors IT Innovation Center	At GM's Atlanta IT Innovation Center, the company designs and delivers in-house IT that drives down the cost of GM's operations while increasing the level and speed of innovative products and services. The 228,000-square-foot GM IT Innovation Center opened in Roswell in 2013.

The centers are focused on color and design, manufacturing and production, testing, prototyping and part analysis.
40	Shaw Industries Create Centre	Flooring manufacturer Shaw Industries is focused on commercial marketing, design and innovation at its 67,000-square-foot Create Centre which opened in Cartersville in 2017. The Shaw Create Centre was awarded Fast Company's 2019 Innovation by Design Award in the workplace category.
