

The Opportunity School District will help our 68,000 children that are trapped in failing schools for no reason other than their address.

On average, failing high schools have only a 56% graduation rate and less than 12% of 3rd grade students enrolled in failing schools are reading on grade level.

What is the Opportunity School District?

The proposed constitutional amendment would authorize the state to step in and intervene in persistently failing public schools and rescue the children languishing in them. This model creates a new, state-run school district, the Opportunity School District (OSD), in which Georgia's worst performing schools can be placed. This model has already been used successfully in others states and allows schools the opportunity to receive the support and undergo the changes they need to improve – free of any restraints or limiting polices imposed by the district.

Ensure Local Control
